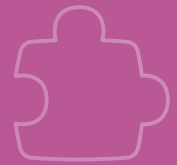



*The answer is **A MINE**. Each number in the code represents a letter, and the same number always stands for the same letter. By analyzing our letter-to-number mapping system where M = 6, I = 8, N = 5, and E = 4, we can determine the correct word for **6854**.*

Four colleagues, Alex, Ben, Chloe, and Daniel, were working on a project. Alex started his task at 10:00 am and finished 20 minutes before Ben. Chloe finished her task at 10:45 am, and she started 15 minutes after Alex. Daniel started his task at 10:10 am and finished at 10:35 am. Ben finished his task at 10:50 am.

**How much longer did Chloe spend on her task than Daniel?**

- A** 5 minutes                      **B** 10 minutes                      **C** 15 minutes  
**D** 20 minutes                      **E** 25 minutes

*The answer is **A**. Chloe started her task at 10:15 am (15 minutes after Alex's 10:00 am start) and finished at 10:45 am, making her total task duration 30 minutes (10:45 am - 10:15 am). Daniel started his task at 10:10 am and finished at 10:35 am, meaning his task duration was 25 minutes (10:35 am - 10:10 am). Comparing their durations, Chloe spent 30 minutes on her task while Daniel spent 25 minutes. Therefore, Chloe spent 5 minutes longer on her task than Daniel, which corresponds to option **A**.*

Using the same pattern for **MOON**, **M** → **P** (+3), **O** → **S** (+4), **O** → **P** (+1), and **N** → **R** (+4). Thus, the correct code for **MOON** is **PSPR**.*

*The answer is **8**. The sum on the **left** is  $48 \div 6 \times 5 = 8 \times 5 = 40$ . The **right-hand side** must also be **equal** to 40. Since  $32 + 8 = 40$ , adding 8 balances both sides. Therefore, the missing number is **8**.*
