






The answer is **A** because **"dont" requires an apostrophe** to correctly form the contraction of "do not." The apostrophe replaces the missing letter "o" in "not." **None of the other words in the sentence require punctuation or capitalisation corrections**, making A the only valid answer.






*The answer is **D** because "appearance" is incorrect in this context. The correct word should be "appearance," with an 'a' before the 'n' rather than an 'e'. "Appearance" refers to the way something looks or seems to others. This word is formed from "appear" plus the suffix "-ance" and should maintain this spelling pattern. Many people incorrectly substitute an 'e' for the 'a' in the suffix. **The rest of the sentence is correct**, so **D** is the only valid answer.*

John Trenchard

In this passage, we are introduced to John Trenchard, who describes his childhood and the area in which he grew up.

1. My name is John Trenchard, and I was fifteen years of age when this story begins. My father and mother had both been dead for years, and I boarded with my aunt, Miss Arnold, who was kind to me in her own fashion, but too strict and precise ever to make me love her.

5. I shall first speak of one evening in the fall of the year 1757. It must have been late in October, though I have forgotten the exact date, and I sat in the little front parlour reading after tea. My aunt had few books; a Bible, a Common Prayer, and some volumes of sermons are all that I can recollect now; but the Reverend Mr. Glennie, who taught us village children, had lent me a story-book, full of interest and adventure, called the Arabian Nights Entertainment. At last the light began to fail, and I was nothing loth to leave off reading for several reasons; as, first, the parlour was a chilly room with horse-hair chairs and sofa, and only a coloured-paper screen in the grate, for my aunt did not allow a fire till the first of November; second, there was a rank smell of molten tallow in the house, for my aunt was dipping winter candles on frames in the back kitchen; third, I had reached a part in the Arabian Nights which tightened my breath and made me wish to leave off reading for very anxiousness of expectation. It was that point in the story of the 'Wonderful Lamp', where the

false uncle lets fall a stone that seals the mouth of the underground chamber; and immures the boy, Aladdin, in the darkness, because he would not give up the lamp till he stood safe on the surface again.

This scene reminded me of one of those dreadful nightmares, where we dream we are shut in a little room, the walls of which are closing in upon us, and so impressed me that the memory of it served as a warning in an adventure that befell me later on. So I gave up reading and stepped out into the street. It was a poor street at best, though once, no doubt, it had been finer. Now, there were not two hundred souls in Moonfleet, and yet the houses that held them straggled sadly over half a mile, lying at intervals along either side of the road. Nothing was ever made new in the village; if a house wanted repair badly, it was pulled down, and so there were toothless gaps in the street, and overrun gardens with broken-down walls, and many of the houses that yet stood looked as though they could stand but little longer.







In these questions, four words are given, but only three of them have number codes. Each letter is assigned a number, and the codes may not appear in the same order as the words. Three of the four words are given in codes. Use this pattern to answer the questions.

Example

TAPE STAR PART EAST
7354 3528 8573

What does 4873 mean?

A TAPE **B** STAR **C** PART **D** REST **E** ARTS

*The answer is **REST**. Each number in the code represents a letter, and the same number always stands for the same letter. By analysing the codes 7354, 3528, and 8573 with their corresponding words STAR, TAPE, and EAST, we can determine that 4 = R, 8 = E, 7 = S, and 3 = T. Looking at these letter-to-number mappings, we can see that the code 4873 represents the letters REST. Thus, the correct word for **4873** is REST.*
