




*The answer is **B** because "however" needs proper punctuation when it connects two independent clauses. It should be preceded by a semicolon and followed by a comma. The correct form would be "concert; however, we left". None of the other words in the sentence require punctuation or capitalisation corrections, making B the only valid answer.*






*The answer is **B** because "coverd" is incorrect in this context. The correct word should be "covered," with an 'e' before the 'd' at the end. "Covered" is the past tense of the verb "cover" and should maintain the 'e' when adding the '-ed' ending. This is a common spelling mistake where the final 'e' is incorrectly omitted when adding a suffix beginning with a consonant. **The rest of the sentence is correct, so B is the only valid answer.***







 $48 \div 12 = 4$, then $4 \times 2 = 8$; $35 \div 7 = 5$, then $5 \times 2 = 10$; $81 \div 9 = 9$, then $9 \times 2 = 18$.
