




The answer is **B** because "**sisters**" requires an **apostrophe** to correctly form the possessive. The correct form is "**my sister's**" (if one sister) or "**my sisters'**" (if multiple sisters). Possessive nouns must include an apostrophe to show ownership. None of the other words in the sentence require corrections, making **B** the only valid answer.






The answer is **B** because "**noisely**" is incorrect in this context. The correct word should be "**noisily**," as adverbs formed from adjectives ending in 'y' (such as 'noisy') change the 'y' to 'i' before adding the suffix '-ly'. "**Noisely**" doesn't follow this spelling rule. **The rest of the sentence is correct, so B is the only valid answer.**

Therefore, "**arrived**", **option A**, is the only correct answer.*

Example

How many hundreds are there in five hundred thousand?

Solution

*Option **C** is correct*

1 hundred thousand = 100,000

Five hundred thousand is written as 500,000.

Dividing 500,000 by 100, We get:

$$500,000/100= 5, 00$$

*Hence, five hundred thousand has **5,000** hundreds*




