



- 2 I am writing to you because I would like to see harsher penalties imposed on dog owners who
- 3 allow their pets to foul the pavements and not clear up the mess. I see new piles of dog waste
- 4 every day when I walk to school. I feel very strongly that this is not acceptable and I would like
- 5 you to do something about it.
- 6 Children especially do not look at the ground as carefully as adults because they are often
- 7 playing or skipping or running. Obviously, they are much more likely to step in dog mess. This
- 8. has happened to me several times recently and also to many of my friends.
- 9 When you get dog mess on your shoes, everyone knows about it. The horrid smell makes you
- 10 feel ashamed, almost as if everyone is looking at you and you often have to take your shoes
- off and leave them outside or run the risk of getting poo all over you when you try to clean
- 12 your shoes. Why should children be made to feel like this?
- 13 If people choose to own dogs, then they should make sure that the pavements are left suit-
- able for everyone to use. It is totally obvious that clearing up dog mess is just as much a part
- of owning a dog as feeding it or taking it for walks. If owners are not prepared to clean up
- after their dog, then they should not own one.
- 17 In summary, I am fed up of ordinary people, particularly children, suffering while they go
- about their daily business as a result of the laziness of some dog owners. While I appreciate
- 19 that most dog owners take their responsibilities seriously, I think that those who don't should
- 20 pay a much heavier penalty.
