1.

Add $\underline{\mathbf{s}}$ to form the plural of most nouns

Example:

Fruit → Fruits

Cake \rightarrow Cakes

 $Scale \rightarrow Scale s$

Add <u>es</u> to nouns that end in <u>ch</u>, <u>sh</u>, <u>s</u>, <u>x</u>, or <u>z</u>.

Example:

Pitch → Pitches

Wish → Wishes

 $Cross \rightarrow Crosses$

 $Fox \rightarrow Foxes$

 $Waltz \rightarrow Waltzes$

3.

For nouns that end in \underline{y} with a consonant before the \underline{y} , change the \underline{y} to \underline{i} and add \underline{es}

Example:

Pony → Ponies

Berry → Berries

Reply → Replies

4.

For nouns that end in \underline{y} with a vowel before the \underline{y} , just add \underline{s}

Example:

Relay → Relays

Alley → Alleys

Pulley → Pulleys

5.

For nouns that end in $\underline{\mathbf{f}}$ or $\underline{\mathbf{fe}}$, drop the $\underline{\mathbf{f}}$ or $\underline{\mathbf{fe}}$, and add $\underline{\mathbf{ves}}$

Example:

Wolf → Wolves

Shelf → Shelves

Wife → Wives

6.

For nouns that end with a consonant before and **o** add **es**

Example:

Avocado → Avocadoes

Buffalo → Buffaloes

Cargo → Cargoes

7.

Some nouns, change the spelling of the singular noun

Example:

Men → Man

Goose → Geese

Nucleus → Nuclei

8.

Some nouns, use the same singular and plural form.

Example:

Aircraft → Aircraft

Trout → Trout

Series → Series



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
